

Mind Map Lesson Plan

Post-Reading Team Mind Maps

Objectives

Students will understand the following:

- 1. The main topic of a multi paragraph text as well as the focus of specific paragraphs
- 2. The meaning of general academic and domain-specific words and phrases in a text
- 3. How to display information from the text in a mind map layout
- 4. How to use teamwork to successfully complete a cohesive and collaborative mind map based on an assigned chapter

Materials

For this lesson, you will need:

- 1. The Pines to Vines text
- 2. Poster paper
- 3. Colored markers

Procedures

- 1. After reading all chapters from the Pines to Vines textbook, assign teams of students (3-5 students per team) one particular chapter to showcase in a mindmap format. Every person on the team must contribute equally to the team task. As a team, the students must collaborate with each other to highlight the main topics from their assigned chapter.
- 2. The criteria for the team mindmaps is as follows:
 - a) include a branch for at least 5 different concepts from the chapter
 - b) include at least two supporting details about each concept from the chapter
 - c) include 3-5 vocabulary terms and their definitions from the chapter
 - d) be full of color
 - e) be neat and have accurate spelling
 - f) have writing that is large enough to read
 - g) include illustrations for each highlight

Adaptations

Create balanced teams with a variety of ability levels in each team to give peer mentoring and role-modeling opportunities.

Pines to Vines

Evaluation

- 1. Teams will share their completed chapter mindmaps with the class.
- 2. Each student in the team will complete a self-evaluation that describes their role and responsibilities with this task.
- 3. The teacher will also complete an evaluation of the team's final product based on their daily productivity, participation, and overall quality of the mindap.
